Hillel Ephros, DMD, MD, is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine and St. George's University School of Medicine. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and served as an Examiner for that Board from 2003-2009. Ephros chairs the Department of Dentistry at St. Joseph's University Medical Center in Paterson, NJ and has directed the residency program in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery sponsored by St. Joseph's for over 25 years. He has published in the scientific literature, authored textbook chapters, and received awards for teaching, including those bestowed by dental students at Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1988-1990, and the Archbishop John J. Meyers Outstanding Educator Award in 2003 at Seton Hall University. Ephros has been elected to fellowship in both the American College of Dentists and the American College of Surgeons.
